Sweden's support in the fight against Ebola

The Government of Sweden is giving high priority to fighting the Ebola outbreak in West Africa. Swedish support is channelled through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency.

Sweden has provided USD 19,4 million (SEK 139,3 million) in humanitarian support since April 2014, of which USD 515 000 (SEK 3.7 million) has been allocated to Guinea; USD 5,6 million (SEK 40,3 million) to Liberia; USD 1,9 million (SEK 13,6 million) to Sierra Leone; USD 146 000 (SEK 1 million) to Sierra Leone and Liberia; and USD 11,2 million (SEK 80,6 million) at the regional level (see table for further details).

Partners supported by Sweden include the World Health Organisation (WHO), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the World Food Programme (WFP)/United Nations Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS), Action Against Hunger/Action Contre la Faim, the International Rescue Committee, the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency, Médecins Sans Frontières, Plan Sverige, Save the Children Sweden, the Swedish Red Cross and Oxfam.

Interventions focus mainly on health and medical support, including investigation and alert measures, and isolation and protection measures. Sweden also provides funding for logistical support and training of health workers, capacity building for health ministries and district/local/community health units, and technical support. Finally, Sweden's support also includes psychosocial support, including activities such as awareness-raising and sensitisation and water and sanitation facilities.

In addition, Sweden is contributing resources via the European Commission to combat the Ebola outbreak. So far, the Commission has raised more than 180 MEUR to help fight the Ebola outbreak, with a focus on strengthening health care systems and the delivery of health services. The Commission will also be supporting the African Union Support to Ebola Outbreak in West Africa (ASEOWA) mission. Sweden's share of support provided via the European Union is approximately 4.9 MEUR (2,74 per cent of EURO 180 million) or USD 6,2 million.
