

## Sweden's support to those affected by the earthquakes in Türkiye and Syria

## Emergency assistance and equipment **EUR 0.6 m** Humanitarian support to the IFRC<sup>1</sup>. 6 FFB Humanitarian support, of which approx. EUR 1.8 million to the IFRC and approx. **7 FEB EUR 2.7 m** EUR 0.9 million to the UN Central Emergency Response Fund. Sweden provides extensive core support to many of the organisations currently working in the affected areas. These include the IFRC (approx. EUR 3.3 million) and OCHA<sup>3</sup> (approx. EUR 16.2 million).

As President of the Council of the European Union, Sweden activated the Council's integrated political crisis response (IPCR) mechanism to coordinate the Member States' support and, with the European Commission, it will co-host a donor conference in Brussels in March.
