


# Sweden's support to those affected by the earthquakes in Türkiye and Syria

Emergency assistance and equipment		
6 FEB	EUR 0.6 m	Humanitarian support to the IFRC <sup>1</sup> .
7 FEB	EUR 2.7 m	Humanitarian support, of which approx. EUR 1.8 million to the IFRC and approx. EUR 0.9 million to the UN Central Emergency Response Fund. Within the framework of the EU Civil Protection Mechanism, Sweden also deployed <b>construction engineers, IT experts and logistics experts</b> .
9 FEB	*	<b>Search and rescue team comprising 45 personnel</b> with search dogs to Türkiye: 5 response team leaders employed by the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency and 40 personnel employed by the Swedish Armed Forces.
10 FEB	EUR 6.8 m	Humanitarian support to Syria from Sida <sup>2</sup> . Support through UN organisations, the Swedish Red Cross and Islamic Relief Sweden for <b>fuel, food, accommodation, medical care and ambulances</b> .
12 FEB	*	Air transport by the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency of <b>300 family tents</b> to Türkiye.
16 FEB	*	Additional delivery by the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency on 12 February, including more <b>large tents, beds, mattresses, food and power plants</b> .
17 FEB	*	<b>500 relief housing units</b> to Türkiye following the European Commission's decision to activate the EU Civil Protection Mechanism to support those affected.
21 FEB	EUR 3 m	Humanitarian support through Sida to respond to basic needs such as <b>winter clothing, water and psychosocial support to children</b> .
1 MAR	EUR 7.6 m	Humanitarian support through Sida, of which approx. EUR 6.3 million to UN organisations and approx. EUR 1.3 million through the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency for <b>1 000 family tents</b> and their air transport.
*Value of all material support: EUR 4.7 million		<b>Total: Approx. EUR 25.4 million</b>

 Sweden provides extensive core support to many of the organisations currently working in the affected areas. These include the IFRC (approx. EUR 3.3 million) and OCHA<sup>3</sup> (approx. EUR 16.2 million).

 As President of the Council of the European Union, Sweden activated the Council's integrated political crisis response (IPCR) mechanism to coordinate the Member States' support and, with the European Commission, it will co-host a donor conference in Brussels in March.
